Fine example of a Queen Anne Two Part Commercial Block, with metal 2nd-story polygonal bays, corbelled brick cornice, and distinctive stone string courses.

## **HISTORIC FEATURES**

Brick exterior; corbelled brick cornice; stone string courses at lintel and sill levels of 2nd story window openings; three 2nd-story polygonal metal bays with pressed metal cornices and ornament; metal corner pilasters at storefront level

## **ALTERATIONS**

Painted brick at front facade; replacement storefront configurations and materials; replacement door to second story; replacement windows in original openings on 2nd story
